Western Illinois Retired Educators (W.I.R.E.) has established a scholarship program for IEA-NEA members. All children, grandchildren, and legal wards of deceased, current IEA-NEA members, divorced, or IEA-Retired members are eligible to apply, regardless of age or marital status, as long as they plan to pursue a career in teaching. All current IEA-NEA certified teachers are eligible to apply for a scholarship as well.

The Committee is now accepting applications to make awards for the 2022-2023 school year. Feel free to photocopy applications as needed. Please read all instructions carefully. The WIRE scholarship committee, composed of the executive board, will be granting \$500.00 scholarships; one or more for high school seniors or college students pursuing a teaching degree, while the second scholarship(s) will be awarded to a current teacher(s) pursuing advancement in the field of education will be offered.

TO BE CONSIDERED FOR THE 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM, ALL APPLICATIONS, COMPLETE WITH SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS, MUST BE POSTMARKED BY Friday, April 15, 2022 at 4:00 p.m.

INFORMATION SHEET

SELECTION CRITERIA

1. Program is open to all high school or college students and current teachers who are pursuing a degree in the field of education.
2. The following criteria will be used to screen applicants.
 - A. Parent/guardian/grandparent is an IEA-NEA member. Children/grandchildren/wards or current IEA-NEA members of deceased, divorced, or IEA-Retired members in good standing may apply. (No agency fee-payer's child/ward may apply for this program.)
 - B. Students, in high school or college, enrolled in coursework that qualifies for certification in an education-related field in Illinois. High school students and individuals not currently enrolled in college who apply for this program must plan to pursue a career in the field of education. Current teachers must pursue advancement in the field of education.
 - C. Commitment to work in your education field in an Illinois public school for at least one (1) year.
 - D. The application with all documentation must be postmarked by **April 15, 2022** or received in the Moline IEA office **by 4:00 p.m.**
3. The applicant is responsible for ensuring and completing that all documents are enclosed with the application.
4. The applicant is responsible for creating the essay. The essay must be typed.
5. The selection committee is responsible for choosing recipients based solely on the merits of the applicant and the information provided on the application.
6. The selection committee requires that the winner(s) write a progress report back to the committee after their first semester (but no later than December 31st) to inform the committee as how this scholarship has enhanced their pursuit of learning and advancement.
7. The selection committee is responsible for selecting top candidate(s) from IEA Regions 17 and 18. Equal importance will be given to applicants:
 - Academic achievement (transcripts)
 - Extra-curricular activities including work and family responsibilities
 - Typed 300-word essay. If longer than 300 words, your application will not be considered.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION

TRANSCRIPTS

1. If you are a high school student, send your most recent official high school transcript which should also show your Grade Point Average. We recognize that final transcripts may not be available.
2. If you are a college student, send your most recent official college transcript (college freshman should send their current official high school transcript)

300-WORD (MAXIMUM) ESSAY: Why I wish to pursue a career in education or advancement in the field of education.

1. The essay must be a creation of the applicant.
2. The essay must be typed.
3. The applicant must sign the essay.

If any social security numbers appear on any documents, please mark through them thoroughly so that they are not legible.
